Dear Sir:

Your letter, addressed to the State Department of Mines, Salem, has been forward to this office for attention.

Your inquiry as to the value of the property owned by the new White Swan Mining Company, which, I believe, has a more specific corporate name—"The White Swan Gold, Inc.", with offices at Baker, Oregon, and Box 915, Yakima, Washington. This mine is in the Virtue District, a few miles out from Baker, Oregon. It is more particularly described as being in the S.W. quarter of Section 25, T. 9 S., R. 41 E. It was most active about the year 1900. The present company apparently began work in September 1935 and have spent about \$175,000 in rehabilitation, development, in mine and mill equipment, and in operation with a production of about \$30,000. The mine shut down on December 11, 1937, with the avowed intention of starting this spring with revised development plans to be furnished by consulting engineers and geologists.

At the time our field engineer visited the property the management was in the act of closing down and because of this closing down a portion of the mine was under water and could not be inspected. It is anticipated that when the mine becomes active again this year we may have more particular information as to the future value of the mine, as determined by the new plans for development and operation.
