Dear Sir:

Your letter of April 26 is received.

Our line from Grants Pass down the Rogue River to Agness carries a very heavy load and it is impossible for us to put additional phones on the line except where absolutely needed by the Service. If you put in a large crew of men for the summer and wish to construct a line from your camp to the Mule Creek Station where switching service can be provided for you in emergencies, such arrangements could be made. Under this plan you would probably have to pay \$2.00 per month for the service in addition to switching service at Merlin or Grants Pass. This would mean that you could call the Mule Creek station and they would switch you on to our main line when it was not being used for official purposes.

During the winter time some arrangement might be made whereby you could use this line free of charge for the consideration of keeping the line up in working order.
