Bonnie Susan - Silver Bullet Claim (Lead & Silver)

- Owners:** The Bonnie Susan claim is owned by Messers. Wolfgram of Mullin, Idaho and McCarthy and Chandler of Wallace, Idaho. The Silver Bullet is a conflicting location claimed by a Mr. Joseph Martin. It is understood from M. W. Cox, A. S. & R. Engineer that the Bonnie Susan claim appears to be the valid location.
- Location:** Four miles southeast from Joseph at an elevation of 7600' by a trail leading from the Lazy T ranch.
- History:** Three old tunnels exist on the property -- all about 60 feet in length with one on an incline. When this work was done, or by whom, is not currently known as the property is not described in existing handbooks, but the workings presumably date back to the early portion of this century. The property was abandoned until claimed by the present owners within the last year or so.
- Geology:** The vein is exposed in a fault fissure for nearly the full length of the claim (1400' estimate). Country rock are argillites and greenstones. The vein contains quartz, calcite and galena and is around 2 to 3 feet in width. The silver content would appear to constitute the primary value of the vein; the galena secondary. The foregoing is according to informant M. W. Cox. Informant B. A. Hanks reports the vein to show consistent mineralization for a distance of 800 feet with the vein width ranging from 18 inches to 3 feet. The strike is almost east and west with a dip of 30 to 45 degrees to the south.

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This property was not visisted. The following report based on information tendered by the informants mentioned. This is the same occurrence as was reported to this Department by B. A. Hanks who examined it for the Martin interests.
