

GEOTHERMAL PROSPECTING PERMIT APPLICATION

1. Description of land:

T8S R7E, approx. 845 feet due west along common section line boundary between secs. 4 and 9, from SE corner of sec. 4, Clackamas County. Clear-cut strip.

2. Describe type of exploration to be done and effect on the land involved:


Drill one 2000-foot temperature gradient hole with truck mounted rotary rig using air and/or mud. Drill cuttings, foam, and mud contained in pits at site. Hole will be completed with observation pipe in accordance with state and federal regulations. Pits lined with plastic if appreciable leakage. Site fully restored upon abandonment.

3. When exploration is to be started and completed:

Start September 25, finish November 10 (or earlier) Observations for 1 year.
